ATTENDANCE:

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning. Being at school for 90% of the time may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a school day each week or 20 days of school during the school year – that is 4 school weeks! Attendance percentages can be misleading so please see the table below which indicates how the number of days absent relates to percentages.

FLU IMMUNISATION

On Tuesday 5th December 2023, we will be welcoming the NHS school-based immunisation team into school to administer the annual flu vaccine to children from Reception to Year 6.

Previously, parents have completed paper consent forms and handed them into school for further handling by the nursing team. This year, and going forward, parental consent will be now be given directly online to the nursing team at rdash.nhs.uk by means of a QR code. By scanning the QR code below, this will enable you to access further information and complete your child's consent form. The nursing team encourage you to complete the online form **even if you do not wish your child to receive their flu spray**, this will avoid further communications from the service.

Uniform Expectations: We will continue to uphold expectations for school uniform, including: A navy blue jumper or cardigan with or without the school logo; grey trousers, skirt or shorts; white or navy-blue polo shirt with or without the school logo; plain white, grey or black socks or plain grey tights; Plain black pumps, trainers or school shoes for inside the school building and a sensible shoe or boot of their choice to play outdoors in.

PE Kit should include: Plain navy-blue polo shirt with or without the school logo; plain black shorts, leggings or cycle shorts; plain black tracksuit bottoms; plain black tracksuit bottoms; plain navy-blue sweatshirt and plain black trainers that are suitable for outdoor sport.

A small plain watch may be worn in Key Stage 2 but this must be removed for PE sessions and play time sessions. Children will not be permitted to wear any watch that beeps or buzzes. Children are also not permitted to wear earrings.

Please ensure uniform is clearly marked with the pupil's name.
