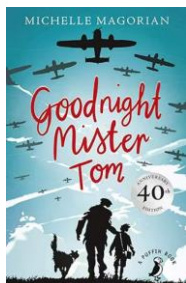


English

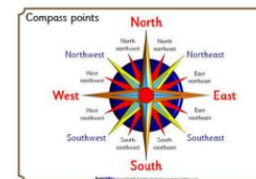
Mathematics

Children will be focusing on position and direction during this half term. They will learn to plot coordinates, reflect and translate shapes. They will also complete the ratio and algebra topics. From week 4, children will focus on SATs revision during maths lessons.

Physical Education

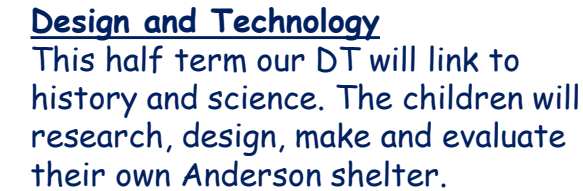
The children will learn skills linked to tennis and rounders with Mr Goddard on a Friday.



Physical, Social, Health Education (PSHE)

This half-term we will focus on transition to secondary school. The children will have a chance to research their secondary school and learn key skills like how to read a timetable and a map of their new school.

This half term in history the children will focus on World War 2. They will learn how it started, how Hitler came into power, how the lives of civilians changed and identify how the war had an impact on Yorkshire and the Humber.



In music, we will be preparing for the end of the year leaver's concert by writing our own song to share with you.



This half term in science the children will learn about electricity. They will be able to draw a scientific circuit, explain how voltage changes the brightness of a bulb and identify what renewable and non-renewable energy is.



In RE, the children will identify what it means for Hindus, Muslims and Christians to commit to key beliefs and explain the similarities and differences between the three religions.

Uniform Expectations: We will continue to uphold expectations for school uniform, including: A navy blue jumper or cardigan with or without the school logo; grey trousers, skirt or shorts; white or navy-blue polo shirt with or without the school logo; plain white, grey or black socks or plain grey tights; Plain black pumps, trainers or school shoes for inside the school building and a sensible shoe or boot of their choice to play outdoors in.
